

We gather with family and friends, on the historic Custom House Plaza to celebrate and share Italian-Sicilian Culture, Cuisine and Traditions. Remembering our shared history, and what we have learned helps to guide us into the future.

The history of Santa Rosalia and the Festa Italia Celebration began in Monterey in 1933. The tradition of the blessing of the Monterey Fishing Fleet and praying for the safety of the fisherman and those who were lost at sea, to Santa Rosalia, the patron Saint of the Monterey fisherman, was established. The four women credited with establishing the sharing of traditional Sicilian food and the blessing of the fishing fleet ceremony were Francesca (Ferranti) Giamona, Giovanna Balbo, Rosa Ferrante and Domenica Enea. The tradition continues today with the Festa Italia Celebration Opening Ceremony, including a procession to the wharf led by the carried Santa Rosalia statue. Through the years, the fisherman's families fished the ocean and bay, bought and built homes, and created businesses which kept Monterey growing. They were and continue to be an important part of the fishing history of the Monterey Peninsula. The Festa Italia Mission continues to honor those men and women who left their homes in Sicily and established new lives in America. Their culture, heritage, and cuisine contributed to the growth of the City of Monterey and the establishment of Monterey as the "Sardine Capital of the World" during World War II.

It is now, 91 years since Francesca, Giovanna, Rosa and Domenica gathered their families, relatives and





All of David's shows are broadcast on KMBY 1240 AM/95.9 FM. He is highly regarded as "Monterey's Emcee" and hosts many local functions and fundraisers including Festa Italia, Santa Rosalia Queen's Coronation Ball, La Merienda/City of Monterey's Annual Birthday Celebration, The City of Monterey's 4th of July on the Lawn, Old Fisherman's Wharf's Annual Birthday Party, The Carmel Summer Live Music Series, and the Italian Heritage Society Awards Ceremony. David is the Winner of BEST TV/RADIO PERSONALITY in the Monterey Herald Readers Poll. And, a 3-time winner of the PGA Media Person of the Year Award. Congressman Jimmy Panetta calls David "The Voice of Monterey".



Erasmo "Orazio" Aiello

Erasmo 'Orazio' Aiello comes from Palermo, Sicily. He has been discovered by musicians eager to share his gift of singing traditional Italian songs and opera with wider audiences. He just returned from Sicily last week.





Pasquale Esposito

Pasquale Esposito was born and raised in Naples, Italy. He immigrated to the United States winning the Green Card Lottery in 1998. He pursued his passion for music by studying at San Jose State University receiving his Bachelor of Arts Degree where he was a distinguished alumnus in 2009. He is an international crossover recording artist, acclaimed for his pop-opera delivery of songs. Esposito released 9 albums and began touring internationally with his first musical revue: Naples ... That's Amore in 2005. Thereafter, he toured with his CD of Original Compositions: A Brand New Me (2009) and II Tempo (2011).

Anthony Lane Band

Anthony "Nino" Lane was born as Antonino Pasquale Cotroneo in Hamilton, Ontario, Canada. Son of Giorgio Cotroneo of Santa Roberto, Reggio Di Calabria and Angelina Musitano of Deglia Nova, Reggio Di Calabria. At the young age of ten Nino began to perform with many bands in the Italian community. Singing mainly in Italian he was known as "the little Italian Singer" While in the Harmony Dance Band he was

fortunate to open up for the Original "Ink Spots " and many other Nationally known headliners. At the Age of fourteen he decided to leave his Italian sound and begin his first rock Band "Double Vision" later to be called "Clear Cut", and they went on to record three albums. The first one under A&M records produced by Daniel Lanios (U-2, Peter Gabriel, Bonnie Raitt"). The second recorded under the CBS label, produced by Bob Destocki (Fast Times at Richmont High, The Ides of March"), and the final one on A & M Records again. At the same time Anthony studied with Rosemary Burns-Gazarra (the wife of Ben Gazzara) in Toronto. Canada. She was a former opera singer (New York Met) who had studied Bell Canto in Italy and had developed a technique for singing pop music. She called it 'the mask' and had been teaching it for many years. Her former students include Bryan Adams, Corey Heart, Jeff Healey, Sebastion Bach

(Skid Row) And James Labrie (Dream Theatre). This would later change Anthony's life. Throughout the 80's Anthony was a part of a powerful musical team. To make it easier in the music business, Anthony changed his name to Lane (Plain Lane is what he would say!) After 14 years on the road working fifty weeks a year, Anthony came to Los Angeles to try to secure a major label record contract. He had made his mark in L.A. but the music scene was beginning to change quickly. Anthony decided to move and open a Club in Monterey, named PLANET GEMINI which he ran successfully for 25 years. To keep Music alive, Nino purchased the Legendary FOX THEATER in Salinas, where he brings major shows and events. Anthony decided to follow his heart and sing the music he once enjoyed - Classic Italian. A performance you will all enjoy!



FESTA ITALIA 2024 GRAND MARSHALL ANTONIO (TONY) DAVI



Antonio (Tony) Davi was born in Isola Delle Femmine, Sicily, on July 7, 1944 to Francesco Davi and Francesca Gina Cardinale. His siblings are Pietro (Peter) Davi of Monterey, Gina Aiello of Isola Delle Femmine and the late Giuseppe (Joe) Davi of Monterey. Tony's mother passed away when he was just three years old. His grandmother Giovanna (Partinico) Davi raised him until his father remarried Giovanna Vassallo, who then raised him and his siblings. At the age of 13, Tony traveled with his brother Peter and arrived in the United States on March 28, 1958. They first stopped in Pittsburg, California to meet and visit Davi cousins before continuing to Monterey to live with his Aunt Mary and Uncle Salvatore Bruno, to then later, live with his father and older brother Joe for a short period of time. While living with his aunt and uncle,


Tony was immediately enrolled in school and started attending Thomas O. Larkin Elementary where he met the love of his life, Santa (Sandi) DaVigo. At the young age of 13 going on 14, he was already talking of marriage telling his brother Peter that he met this beautiful girl named Sandi DaVigo and one day he would marry her. About six years later they married in 1966 and had three children: Gina, Frank and Santo, As a family, they created life long memories spending time with family and friends having picnics and barbeques and going camping in Big Sur and Konocti. In 1976, Tony and his family took a trip, along with his brother Peter's family, back home to Sicily. Since then, Tony has made many trips back home to Sicily. Tony and Sandi stayed married until the day Sandi went to heaven on August 24, 2022 and met her father, Santo DaVigo, for the first time. She never knew him as he had drowned in a boating accident while fishing in Santa Monica before she was born.

During Tony's high school days, he worked for Rappa's Sea Foods Restaurant, Joseph Restaurant, The Red Pony, Neptune's Table and Mike's Seafood on Monterey's Fisherman's Wharf. Later, he worked at The Harbor Inn in Moss Landing, the Sardine Factory and the Butcher Shop in Carmel. He then owned and operated with his children, along with his brother Peter and his family, Flavor's Café and Grill. He also opened The Cannery Grill Restaurant with his wife and children, both restaurants on Cannery Row. Tony's love for cooking and food supported him for years, but his love for fishing grew stronger. He knew fishing was the path he'd hope to take and keep the family tradition alive following in his father's footsteps. Tony's fishing career started with Rosario Aiello on Rosario's boat, "New Stella", fishing for squid in the Monterey Bay. This is when Tony truly fell in love with fishing. Tony later owned and operated his first boat called "Sandi D". He continued fishing in the Monterey Bay, Point Sur and also in the San Francisco Bay for Herring. In addition, his journey continued for twelve summers in Bristol Bay, Alaska fishing for sockeye salmon. He later acquired the fishing boat "Di Mi Ann" from Raoul Bruno, fishing Herring in San Francisco. Tony and Raoul partnered together in construction, alongside fishing. At this time Tony became master of various trades, such as plastering, tile setting, plumbing, carpentry and electrician. Later in life, with his son Frank, they bought a 32-foot bow picker named "Silver Streak" where they fished

together for Herring in San Francisco for many years.

Tony has worked hard all of his life to provide for his family. He would do anything to help a family member or friend in need, and he cherishes his close relationships with his loved ones. His main purpose in life now is to enjoy his time with all of them. He's grateful for his close relationships with his brother Peter and sister Gina. He appreciates time with his son Santo, daughter Gina, daughterin-law Joelle, and his grandchildren Colin, Corey (Delica), Daniella, Alley, Antonio and Santo, especially after suffering the passing of his son Frank earlier this year. Frank was the pearl of the family that everyone loved. Tony is a very strong willed and strong minded man who will continue to thrive with the support from Monterey's Italian community.

Tony is grateful to be the 2024 Grand Marshall of this year's Festa Italia. He is the proud Nonno of two past Festa Italia Queens. His granddaughter Daniella was crowned Queen in 2013 and his granddaughter Alley was crowned Queen in 2015. His Family has been a part of the Festa Italia, Santa Rosalia for many generations. His children, along with nieces and nephews were Tarantella Dancers growing up and have celebrated Festa Italia ever since. We thank you for honoring him and recognizing our family. May God Bless Tony Davi as the 2024 Grand Marshall and Viva Monterey's Santa Rosalia!



Bounty of the Sea Exhibit

Located at the Stanton Center next to Festa Italia



The Festa Italia Foundation in partnership with the Italian Heritage Society has created a timeline exhibit of the history of fishing in Monterey Bay—Bounty of the Sea—the exhibit includes text, photos and stories. The exhibit emphasizes the Sicilian/Italian contributions made during the sardine era that led to Monterey earning the title of Sardine Capital of the World. The display covers the Pittsburg connection, the Santa Rosalia ceremonial blessing of the fleet, the Festa Italia Celebration, a Tarantella traditional dress along with information on fishing boats, nets, canneries and the wharfs. It also highlights information on Indigenous, Chinese, Portuguese, and Japanese fishermen, the Western Flyer, and the Monterey Bay Fishing Trust.

The exhibit is located at the Monterey History and Art Stanton Center at the Custom House Plaza. Viewing is available Wednesday - Monday from Noon to 4 pm. Admission fees are charged.







History of Bocce

- The first documented history of the game was in 5200 BC in a painting in an Egyptian tomb.
- Bocce spread through Palestine and by 600 BC was adopted by the Greeks, who passed it on to the Romans.
- In 1319 AD, Bocce was prohibited from play by anyone of lesser than noble status, as it was feared that it took too much time away from practical endeavors and military training.
- By 1519, the game once again became public and spread to places like Belgium and Holland.
- The Republic of Venice condemned the sport in 1576 and the Catholic Church prohibited clergymen from playing bocce.
- Guissepi Garibaldi, sometimes referred to as the George Washington of Italy, popularized the sport and made it what it is today whilst unifying Italy.
- In 1896, the first Bocce Olympiad was played in Athens, Greece. It has been an international sport ever since.
- The first bocce clubs were formed in Italy and the first recorded Italian league was established in 1947. This was also the first year of the annual Bocce World Championships.

Sicilian Style Marinated Calamari Salad

Ingredients
1 small onion
2 whole garlic
1 green bell pepper
1 yellow bell pepper
1red bell pepper
1lb cooked calamari, cut in rings (boiled in salted water just until tender, about 2 minutes...as soon as they
turn white) or (1 lb) calamari, cleaned and sliced
into rings, tentacles left whole, then cooked

3 tablespoons olive oil

- 2 tablespoons red wine vinegar
- 2 -3 tablespoons chopped parsley

salt and pepper

Directions

- Finely sliced onion, Red, Yellow & Green bell peppers.
- Make the vinaigrette: Whisk olive oil, vinegar, salt and pepper until combined.
- Mince Garlic
- Add cooked calamari
- Toss all ingredients in a bowl and chill for an hour before serving.
- For a prettier salad, arrange lettuce leaves on a serving platter, top with salad and garnish with parsley sprigs and lemon wedges.



Calamari Scampi

Serves 2 to 4 - Ingredients

- 1/2 pound linguini or thin spaghetti
- 1 pound squid bodies (5 to 10 bodies, depending on the size)
- 2 tablespoons extra virgin olive oil, divided
- 2 tablespoons Capers
- 2 tablespoons butter
- 2 cloves garlic, finely minced
- 1 tablespoon fresh lemon juice
- 1/4 cup chopped fresh herbs, such as parsley, basil, or chives, or any combination
- 1/4 cup pasta water, if needed
- Salt and pepper to taste
- Lemon slices for garnish

Directions

• Bring a large pot of water with a nice amount of salt to a boil and cook the pasta according to directions. Save some pasta water just before straining.

• Cut the squid into rings, and dry slightly with a paper towel. In a large skillet, heat the olive oil and capers over medium-high heat. Add the squid and cook, stirring constantly, for 3 to 5 minutes. Season with salt and pepper as you cook. Try one or two starting at 3 minutes to gauge doneness. The rings will be white and tender when cooked.

• Remove the squid from the skillet and turn the heat to low. Add the remaining tablespoon of olive oil, the butter, and the garlic to the same pan, and sauté for less than one minute until the garlic is fragrant. Stir in the lemon juice and then return the squid to the pan. Mix in the pasta and the fresh herbs. Add some reserved pasta water if the dish needs extra moisture.

• Serve immediately, garnished with 2 or 3 thin lemon slices.

Calamari Diablo

Ingredients 4tablespoons olive oil 5minced garlic cloves 1tablespoon red pepper flakes 2green onions, chopped 10 ounces diced Chorizo 1cup dry white wine 8 squid, tubes and tentacles cut tubes into rings 1cup tomato puree 1/2cup fresh grated pecorino romano cheese 1lb pasta, of your choice 4 -5sprigs of chopped parsley (to garnish)

Directions

Heat oil in non stick skillet, add garlic, green onions, red pepper flake and pepperoni, bring to simmer.

• Turn up heat and add wine while stirring constantly. Bring to near boil.

• Add shrimp and cook for one minute, then flip and cook for another minute. (I hate overcooked shrimp, so at this point I removed shrimp and placed in a bowl.).

• Add squid rings and tentacles. They will cook very quickly so pay close attention. After 2 minutes return shrimp to skillet. Reduce heat to simmer.

- Add your tomato puree. This is where you can be creative. I actually used one cup of Barilla's Arrabbiata sauce for extra kick!
- Grate in some of the fresh Pecorino Romano cheese and stir inches Remove from heat.



Saint Rosalia HER STORY



Who was Santa Rosalia? She was born in 1130 AD and is the Patron Saint of Palermo, Sicily. According to legend, Rosalia was born to a Norman noble family that claimed descent from Charlemagne. Devoutly religious she abandoned her family's wealth and royal lifestyle to live as a hermit in a cave on Mount Pellegrino, where she died alone in 1166. Tradition says that she was led to the cave by two angels. There she lived as a hermit dedicating her life to prayer and solitude.

According to her story, a ship carrying the bubonic plague landed in Palermo in May 1624. The epidemic that ensued caused the deaths of about one third of Palermo's population. The epidemic raged on until the middle of July when a young man, Matteo Bonello, had a vision in which Rosalia appeared to him and directed him to her cave. She instructed him to retrieve her bones and to carry them to the four corners of the city. Bonello found the cave, Rosalia's bones and a rock with Rosalia's name on it. He carried the bones to the city and soon Palermo's horrible plague was over. Santa Rosalia became the patron saint of the City of Palermo. In fact, she is generally revered throughout Sicily.

Every July 15-17, Palermo holds a festival to commemorate the ending of the plague and to honor their patron saint. The annual festivities are elaborate and attract people from great distances. The Community of Isola delle Femmine is a mere 15 kilometers from Palermo. Many of the original Isola delle Femmine immigrants participated in Palermo's annual festivals bringing the tradition to Monterey.

In 1933, the tradition of blessing the fishing fleet and mass at San Carlos Cathedral followed by Saint Rosalia traveling in a procession to the Monterey Wharf was established. As Santa Rosalia traveled from the Cathedral she is led by the Local Catholic clergy, Knights of Columbus, the congregation and community members. Upon arriving at the waterfront, the names of those lost at sea are read aloud and a wreath is placed in their honor. A blessing is offered for all who make their living on or by the Monterey Bay.

No Italian wedding or celebration would be complete without the rhythmic song and dance of the Tarantella. It is considered by some to be the most popular of all the Italian songs and it is even considered by many as the song of Italy. The dance is both lively and graceful, with light and quick steps mixed with passionate gestures. The Tarantella, originally an Italian folk dance of the lower-and middle-classes has been labeled as a dance to cure sickness. Legend states that between the 15th and 17th centuries, an epidemic of tarantism swept through the

town of Taranto in southern Italy, from being bitten by the poisonous tarantula spider. The victim, which is referred to as the tarantata, once bitten, could fall into a trance that could only be cured by frenzied dancing. People would surround the victim while musicians would play mandolins, guitars and tambourines in search of the correct rhythm. Each bet would have a different effect on the tarantata causing various movements and gestures. Once the correct rhythm was found, it was almost certain that the tarantata was cured. The Tarantella Dancers of Monterey perform annually at Festa Italia and other cultural events.
