### David Marzetti, Master of Ceremonies/Singer

This is the 32nd year that David Marzetti has emceed and performed at Festa Italia with his close friend, Mike Marotta. David comes from a radio background that spans over 48 years. Besides his weekly M-F Afternoon Show 3-6p, David hosts the "ShagBag Show" every Saturday morning as well as "Sundays with Sinatra: Live from Old Fisherman's Wharf". All of David's shows are broadcast on KMBY 1240 AM/95.9 FM. He is highly regarded as "Monterey's Emcee" and hosts many local functions and fundraisers including Festa Italia, Santa Rosalia Queen's Coronation Ball, La Merienda/City of Monterey's Annual Birthday Celebration, The City of Monterey's 4th of July on the Lawn, Old Fisherman's Wharf's Annual Birthday Party, The Carmel Summer Live Music Series, and the Italian Heritage Society Awards Ceremony. David is the Winner of BEST TV/RADIO PERSONALITY in the Monterey Herald Readers Poll. And, a 3-time winner of the PGA Media Person of the Year Award. Congressman Jimmy Panetta calls David "The Voice of Monterey".



### Erasmo "Orazio" Aiello

Erasmo 'Orazio' Aiello comes from Palermo, Sicily. He has been discovered by musicians eager to share his gift of singing traditional Italian songs and opera with wider audiences. He just returned from Sicily last week.



### **Pasquale Esposito**

Pasquale Esposito was born and raised in Naples, Italy. He immigrated to the United States winning the Green Card Lottery in 1998. He pursued his passion for music by studying at San Jose State University receiving his Bachelor of Arts Degree where he was a distinguished alumnus in 2009. He is an international crossover recording artist, acclaimed for his pop-opera delivery of songs. Esposito released 9 albums and began touring internationally with his first musical revue: Naples ... That's Amore in 2005. Thereafter, he toured with his CD of Original Compositions: A Brand New Me (2009) and Il Tempo (2011).



### **Anthony Lane Band**

Anthony "Nino" Lane was born as Antonino Pasquale Cotroneo in Hamilton, Ontario, Canada. Son of Giorgio Cotroneo of Santa Roberto, Reggio Di Calabria and Angelina Musitano of Deglia Nova, Reggio Di Calabria. At the young age of ten Nino began to perform with many bands in the Italian community. Singing mainly in Italian he was known as "the little Italian Singer" While in the Harmony Dance Band he was fortunate to open up for the Original "Ink Spots" and many other Nationally known headliners. At the Age of fourteen he decided to leave his Italian sound and begin his first rock Band "Double Vision" later to be called "Clear Cut", and they went on to record three albums. The first one under A&M records produced by Daniel Lanios (U-2, Peter Gabriel. Bonnie Raitt"). The second recorded under the CBS label, produced by Bob Destocki (Fast Times at Richmont High, The Ides of March"), and the final one on A & M Records again. At the same time Anthony studied with Rosemary Burns-Gazarra (the wife of Ben Gazzara) in Toronto, Canada. She was a former opera singer (New York Met) who had studied Bell Canto in Italy and had developed a technique for singing pop music. She called it 'the mask' and had been teaching it for many years. Her former students include Bryan Adams, Corey Heart, Jeff Healey, Sebastion Bach

(Skid Row) And James Labrie (Dream Theatre). This would later change Anthony's life. Throughout the 80's Anthony was a part of a powerful musical team. To make it easier in the music business, Anthony changed his name to Lane (Plain Lane is what he would say!) After 14 years on the road working fifty weeks a year, Anthony came to Los Angeles to try to secure a major label record contract. He had made his mark in L.A. but the music scene was beginning to change quickly. Anthony decided to move and open a Club in Monterey, named PLANET GEMINI which he ran successfully for 25 years. To keep Music alive, Nino purchased the Legendary FOX THEATER in Salinas, where he brings major shows and events. Anthony decided to follow his heart and sing the music he once enjoyed - Classic Italian. A performance you will all enjoy!



# FESTA ITALIA 2025 GRAND MARSHALL PAUL PETER ALIOTTI



Paul Peter Aliotti was born on December 17, 1946, on the island of Marettimo, Sicily, to Domenico Aliotti and Francesca Torrente. He is the third of four children. His siblings are Giuseppe Aliotti (Enza), Grand Marshal of Festa Italia 2012; Antonietta Asaro (Salvatore); and Giovanna D'Aquanno (Felipo).

In 1958, at the age of 11, Paul immigrated to the United States with his mother and sisters to reunite with his father and brother. The family settled in Monterey, California, on Monroe Street in the neighborhood affectionately known as Spaghetti Hill.

Domenico, a lifelong fisherman, was the driving force behind the family's move to Monterey. He worked aboard his own boat in both Monterey Bay and the waters off Alaska, passing on the tradition of fishing to his sons, Paul and Giuseppe.

By age 13, Paul was balancing school with work, washing dishes at Rappa's Restaurant on the wharf. He worked there for five years before moving to Lou's Fish Grotto, where he became a cook. It was during this time that Paul received the devastating news that his mother had passed away from breast cancer. Shortly afterward, he left Lou's in search of new opportunities.

Paul eventually walked into the Sardine Factory and asked cofounder Bert Cutino for a job. He was hired as a cook and remained there for three years. In 1971, while still working at the Sardine Factory, Paul began fishing for salmon in Alaska with his brother Joe aboard the Baby Francis. He later worked as a waiter at the Hyatt and The Rouge, continuing to fish during the summer months.

In June of 1973, fate intervened. Paul crossed paths with Sandy Scardina at San Diego Federal Bank in downtown Monterey. He knew of her through his sisters. They chatted briefly—he was heading to Alaska, and she was preparing for a trip to Sicily. Before parting ways, Paul joked that he owed her a drink when he returned. Sometime later, Sandy called The Rouge late one evening and reminded Paul of his promise. They met for drinks, followed by coffee at Denny's. Six months later, they were engaged. On September 28, 1974, they were married at Carmel Mission Church.

Their first child, Domenic Paul Aliotti, was born on February 29, 1976. At the time, both Paul and Sandy were working in restaurants to support their growing family. In May of 1977, they purchased Victorian Corner Restaurant in Pacific Grove. Their second son, Paul Salvatore Aliotti (Pauley), was born on June 25, 1979. That same year, the couple completed construction on their home in Pebble Beach. Their daughter, Maria Francesca Aliotti, completed the family on August 19, 1984.

During these years, Paul balanced restaurant life with seasonal fishing trips. In 1989, he and Sandy designed and built their own fishing vessel, Miss Maria, in Seattle, Washington—launching Paul's 30-year career as an independent fisherman. Over the years, both Domenic and Pauley joined their father aboard Miss Maria in Alaska. From 1998 to 2004, Paul also fished for herring in San Francisco during the winter months.

In 2007, while in Bristol Bay, Alaska, Paul suffered a near-fatal accident. He fell from a barge ladder, and his foot became entangled in a buoy line, leaving him dangling between the barge and his boat. Miraculously, he survived the fall, made a full recovery, and returned to fishing the following season without missing a beat.

Tragedy struck in 2014 when Paul's beloved wife, Sandy, passed away unexpectedly. Despite the immense grief, Paul continued fishing in Alaska until 2020. That same year, Pauley took over as captain of Miss Maria, ensuring that the family's fishing legacy would carry on.

Today, Paul enjoys mornings at Aliotti's Victorian Corner with his son Domenic, daughter-in-law Mary, loyal customers, and cherished friends. He also loves spending time with his three grandchildren, visiting with Pauley when he's in town from Orange County, and connecting with his daughter Maria, who was crowned Santa Rosalia Queen in 2000 and has proudly kept the family's Sicilian traditions alive since Sandy's passing.

Paul is deeply honored to serve as Grand Marshal of Festa Italia 2025. His family has deep roots in the celebration, with several nieces and grand-nieces having served as Queens and court members. Paul and his family extend heartfelt thanks to the Festa Italia Board of Directors for this recognition.

May God bless Festa Italia and everyone involved in preserving our shared traditions.


### BOCCE Ci vediamo al campo de bocce!




### **History of Bocce**

- The first documented history of the game was in 5200 BC in a painting in an Egyptian tomb.
- Bocce spread through Palestine and by 600 BC was adopted by the Greeks, who passed it on to the Romans.
- In 1319 AD, Bocce was prohibited from play by anyone of lesser than noble status, as it was feared that it took too much time away from practical endeavors and military training.
- By 1519, the game once again became public and spread to places like Belgium and Holland.
- The Republic of Venice condemned the sport in 1576 and the Catholic Church prohibited clergymen from playing bocce.
- Guissepi Garibaldi, sometimes referred to as the George Washington of Italy, popularized the sport and made it what it is today whilst unifying Italy.
- In 1896, the first Bocce
   Olympiad was played in
   Athens, Greece. It has been
   an international sport ever
   since.
- The first bocce clubs were formed in Italy and the first recorded Italian league was established in 1947. This was also the first year of the annual Bocce World Championships.





#### Classic Fisherman's Wharf Cioppino

Chef Tene Shake Signature Recipe

Cioppino is a tomato-based seafood stew that was originated by the San Francisco Italian fishermen of North Beach in the late 1800s using whatever seafood was left over from the day's catch.

Serves 8-10

3 Cups Marinara (your favorite prepared brand or homemade)

1/2 Cup Butter

2 Thsps.. Garlic, minced

1 Cup Clam Juice

1 Cup of White Wine

1/2 lb Cod - cut into 2" chunks

1/2 lb Swordfish- cut into 2" chunks

6 ea. Scallops

6 ea. Prawns

1/2 Ib Dungeness Crab Legs - Cracked at the joints

6 ea. Clams

6 ea. Mussels

- 1. Melt the butter in a large, deep sauté pan.
- 2. Add the garlic and stir together over medium heat.
- 3. Add the marinara, clam juice and white wine and stir to incorporate for 5 minutes
- 4. Carefully add all fish and shellfish to the marinara and combine.
- 5. Cover and simmer together for 15-20 mins.

Serve with some crusty garlic bread and a glass of Monterey County Chardonnay



#### Calamari Scampi

Serves 2 to 4 - Ingredients

- 1/2 pound linguini or thin spaghetti
- 1 pound squid bodies (5 to 10 bodies, depending on the size)
- 2 tablespoons extra virgin olive oil, divided
- 2 tablespoons Capers
- 2 tablespoons butter
- 2 cloves garlic, finely minced
- 1 tablespoon fresh lemon juice
- 1/4 cup chopped fresh herbs, such as parsley, basil, or chives, or any combination
- 1/4 cup pasta water, if needed
- Salt and pepper to taste Lemon slices for garnish

#### Directions

- Bring a large pot of water with a nice amount of salt to a boil and cook the pasta according to directions. Save some pasta water just before straining.
- Cut the squid into rings, and dry slightly with a paper towel. In a large skillet, heat the olive oil and capers over medium-high heat. Add the squid and cook, stirring constantly, for 3 to 5 minutes. Season with salt and pepper as you cook. Try one or two starting at 3 minutes to gauge doneness. The rings will be white and tender when cooked.
- Remove the squid from the skillet and turn the heat to low. Add the remaining tablespoon of olive oil, the butter, and the garlic to the same pan, and sauté for less than one minute until the garlic is fragrant. Stir in the lemon juice and then return the squid to the pan. Mix in the pasta and the fresh herbs. Add some reserved pasta water if the dish needs extra moisture.
- Serve immediately, garnished with 2 or 3 thin lemon slices.

#### Calamari Diablo

Ingredients

4tablespoons olive oil

5minced garlic cloves

1tablespoon red pepper flakes 2green onions, chopped

10 ounces diced Chorizo

1cup dry white wine

8 squid, tubes and tentacles cut tubes into rings 1cup tomato puree

1/2cup fresh grated pecorino romano cheese 1lb pasta, of your choice

4 -5sprigs of chopped parsley (to garnish)

#### Directions

Heat oil in non stick skillet, add garlic, green onions, red pepper flake and pepperoni, bring to simmer.

- Turn up heat and add wine while stirring constantly. Bring to near boil.
- Add shrimp and cook for one minute, then flip and cook for another minute. (I hate overcooked shrimp, so at this point I removed shrimp and placed in a bowl.).
- Add squid rings and tentacles. They will cook very quickly so pay close attention. After 2 minutes return shrimp to skillet. Reduce heat to simmer.
- Add your tomato puree. This is where you can be creative. I actually used one cup of Barilla's Arrabbiata sauce for extra kick!
- Grate in some of the fresh Pecorino Romano cheese and stir inches Remove from heat.



## Saint Rosalia HER STORY





















Who was Santa Rosalia? She was born in 1130 AD and is the Patron Saint of Palermo, Sicily. According to legend, Rosalia was born to a Norman noble family that claimed descent from Charlemagne. Devoutly religious she abandoned her family's wealth and royal lifestyle to live as a hermit in a cave on Mount Pellegrino, where she died alone in 1166. Tradition says that she was led to the cave by two angels. There she lived as a hermit dedicating her life to prayer and solitude.

According to her story, a ship carrying the bubonic plague landed in Palermo in May 1624. The epidemic that ensued caused the deaths of about one third of Palermo's population. The epidemic raged on until the middle of July when a young man, Matteo Bonello, had a vision in which Rosalia appeared to him and directed him to her cave. She instructed him to retrieve her bones and to carry them to the four corners of the city. Bonello found the cave, Rosalia's bones and a rock with Rosalia's name on it. He carried the bones to the city and soon Palermo's horrible plague was over. Santa Rosalia became the patron saint of the City of Palermo. In fact, she is generally revered throughout Sicily.

Every July 15-17, Palermo holds a festival to commemorate the ending of the plague and to honor their patron saint. The annual festivities are elaborate and attract people from great distances. The Community of Isola delle Femmine is a mere 15 kilometers from Palermo. Many of the original Isola delle Femmine immigrants participated in Palermo's annual festivals bringing the tradition to Monterey.

In 1933, the tradition of blessing the fishing fleet and mass at San Carlos Cathedral followed by Saint Rosalia traveling in a procession to the Monterey Wharf was established. As Santa Rosalia traveled from the Cathedral she is led by the Local Catholic clergy, Knights of Columbus, the congregation and community members. Upon arriving at the waterfront, the names of those lost at sea are read aloud and a wreath is placed in their honor. A blessing is offered for all who make their living on or by the Monterey Bay.

Santa Rosalia's float is adorned with fresh flowers donated in honor and memory of fishing families. There are a limited number of spots available. If you are interested in honoring a family member, please contact Phyllis Grillo at pgrillo831@gmail.com 0r (831) 402-8030

The Tarantella Dancers perform on Saturday and Sunday at Festa Italia. No Italian wedding or celebration would be complete without the rhythmic song and dance of the Tarantella. It is considered by some to be the most popular of all the Italian songs and it is even considered by many as the song of Italy. The dance is both lively and graceful, with light and quick steps mixed with passionate gestures. The Tarantella, originally an Italian folk dance of the lower-and middle-classes has been labeled as a dance to cure sickness. Legend states that between the 15th and 17th centuries, an epidemic of tarantism swept through the

town of Taranto in southern Italy, from being bitten by the poisonous tarantula spider. The victim, which is referred to as the tarantata, once bitten, could fall into a trance that could only be cured by frenzied dancing. People would surround the victim while musicians would play mandolins, guitars and tambourines in search of the correct rhythm. Each bet would have a different effect on the tarantata causing various movements and gestures. Once the correct rhythm was found, it was almost certain that the tarantata was cured. The Tarantella Dancers of Monterey perform annually at Festa Italia and other cultural events.
